Dundonald Old Mill is situated on the circuit of the Ards TT motor car race, which was first held on 18th August 1928. The circuit was in the form of a triangle - 13.7 miles in total. It started at the pits on the Newtownards Road, Dundonald, then set off towards Newtownards via Quarry Corner, then up and over Bradshaw's Brae and into Conway Square, Newtownards. The cars then left Newtownards on the fastest part of the course along the straight road to Comber. Then round the notorious "Butcher's Shop" corner in Comber, along the Ballystockart Road to the hairpin in Dundonald, and back to the pits to start the circuit all over again. The races continued very successfully each year until 1936 when one of the competing cars crashed at Newtownards killing eight spectators and injuring 40 others.
